Institutional Distinctiveness

As a unit of U.P government higher education, KMGGPG College, Badalpur GB Nagar is providing quality education to the girls of rural areas to achieve the empowerment of women. The vision of the college is to develop the whole nation to bridge the rural-urban divide by providing low-cost quality higher education to the girl's students of socio-economically weaker section of the area nearby. Students are indicative of the richness and development of their college. It is a matter of real happiness that the college was started with 26 students and

presently 2000 students are studying in the college, the increasing number of students is itself the proof of a continuous process of development. In every academic year, the result of the college is above 90%, which is also proof of the continuous efforts made by teachers and sincerity of the students.

Besides the teaching process, to develop the intellectual and reasoning qualities of the students and for the all-round development, every year Debate competition, poem recitation, essay writing, Slogan writing, Rangoli making, poster and G.K competition are organized by the departmental councils of the college. To encourage the students, the winning students are awarded in the Annual function at the end of every academic year.

The college is successfully running 13 subjects at the UG level and 10 subjects at PG level. Under the professional courses. B.Ed Department is giving training to 100 students since 2015 and the students can get admission through combined state level entrance examination. The college has research center in every subject in which 35 students are registered as Ph.D. or PDF students. Two B.VOC. courses have also been started in the college. The college also has 10 certificate courses in different streams running as Add- on- Courses for students. The college organizes national seminars, workshops, and symposiums to energies the thought process of intellectuals. These programs are funded by UGC, ICSSR and the Department of Higher education U.P.

To make the girl's student self- dependent, and to develop the qualities of leadership the unit of NCC, NSS and Rangers are registered in the college. 100 students in NSS, 68 in NCC and 132 in Rangers are registered. The college is in a rural area, and students come from remote areas, sometimes due to circumstances, they cannot continue their studies. Bearing this fact in mind, the college has started as the center of IGNOU; the students get admission on different courses and the college has an examination center also. College also takes initiative for making college campus as a green and clean campus. The college installs sanitary pad vending machines for students' welfare.

The college's faculties are using new innovative teaching technologies to impart quality education to the students. The college is equipped with smart classrooms. PPT's are the mode of teaching. ICT and smart rooms are another feature of teaching techniques. The

campus has Wi-Fi, and this facility is also available for the students. E-library is useful for the students to search for research. Scholarship and Fee reimbursement facility is provided to the needy students by the social welfare department of U.P. The students whose annual income is less than 200000 per annum are eligible to apply for this and they can continue their study without any hindrance. Every year, sports competitions are arranged/conducted in the college for physical development and the students' mental development. In our college students are provided with career counseling for employment and higher education. Our motto is to enrich knowledge, research attitude and skills of graduates for future prospects. Our students will become well-educated leaders and global citizens excelling at addressing the challenges of the 21st century.

2 Supporting students from disadvantaged background and students who score highest

Practices for supporting students having disadvantaged background and score high rank Disadvantaged students are less likely to be prepared for college and may be unaware of key deadlines. Application guidance should start early in a student's career, supporting them through the research process, reminding them of open days and key deadlines, and preparing them to enter the applications stage. Information, advice, and guidance should be customized to the student. Students must make decisions which are the best for them – bearing in mindtheir grades and preferences. Since all students" grades and preferences vary,

information should be customized appropriately. This could include, for example, providing

students with a set of universities that are "reach," "safety" and "match" to their A-level grades at, or before the application stage. This could be an automated feature of the KMGGPGC website. "Hands on" guidance may be the most effective means to help students manage the process. Where possible, pre-populating areas of the KMGGPGC form – such as the financial aid sections - may encourage students to finish and submit the form. Having school based "application workshops" where students can complete their applications with teachers present, is likely to increase applications. Matching applicants with coaches who understand how to navigate the system may also be effective but will be more expensive and difficult to manage. Students respond to rules of thumb or "default settings" on application forms. The KMGGPGC form could be adapted, for example by requiring students to list at least one Safety University, reach university or match university. Similarly, personal statements should include "prompts" to increase transparency in what they should contain. Allowing only one example of an extra-curricular activity or work experience could also help level the playing field here. · College treat grade predictions differently, contextualize offers, and often look at a range of information on the candidates. They must make their processes more transparent - by publicizing how these decisions are made, and by working more closely with schools to share this information. A more consistent approach to offer-making across college would also benefit disadvantaged students. Carpentry Lab

This lab will enable the students to learn the fundamentals of sculpting in wood. The lab would be fully equipped with all the required state-of-the-art tools. The lab provides avenues for creative exploration and aids in designing furniture and wooden artefacts. Students will be guided through the processes by a master carpenter.

Lithography Lab

Lithography is an art form that aids creativity amongst the students. In this lab, the students will be taken through the process of printing from a flat surface treated to repel the ink except where required for printing - applied on a wood block or metal plate.

Pottery / Sculpting Lab

The pottery lab has three pottery wheels. Students will be trained in forming artistic objects with clay. The lab tries to instill new skills and creativity amongst the students and help them enjoy working in clay with bare hands. Adding that with pottery, one can produce something to express oneself. Many pottery enthusiasts find the experience soothing. Pottery increases optimistic outlook, provides an outlet for grief or anxiety, and helps one with self-identification and self-expression, bolstering confidence and self-esteem

Students will be trained on loom to weave cloth and tapestry. This lab's main purpose is not the act of weaving, but the act of creating the design for a piece of cloth, bed sheet, or tapestry. The skills learned in this lab can be used by students in applying for jobs in Apparel designing.

Painting Lab

Art and architecture are closely interlinked. So, what is an architect who does not have the flair for the pure art form of drawing and painting. A drawing and painting studio, where students can exercise their full potential for creativity can be built. In this lab, students will be taken through various painting media like encaustic, tempera, fresco, oil, acrylic &water colour.

Brick Kiln

A lab where the students can see how the basic building material of brick is made. But the kiln is not only for baking bricks, but also any other products that can be made, for example the products coming out of the pottery lab. In this lab the aim is to train the students to make clay products by firing them in kiln at hot temperatures to give them a hard, durable form - terracotta.

The college has a good number of research students and professors and therefore some arrangements also need to be made to facilitate them to sit in the library and read in a peaceful environment. The need for development of basic infrastructure facilities is being felt. It is also noteworthy in this regard that the development of the library is also necessary to meet the standard of an organization like NAAC, formed for the evaluation of the quality of higher education institutions.

The college has a 56 KW electrical connection, which operates various electrical equipment. Due to electricity consumption, the college must pay an electricity bill of about ₹ 50000 per month. To reduce the excessive amount of electricity bill and in view of environmental protection, a 40 KW solar power plant will be installed in the college. In this sequence, after contacting the government agencies, applications will be prepared and sent to the concerned departments for government grants. Along with this, efforts will also be made to ensure that the said solar power plant is established in the college in the budget year 2023-24. In the coming years, its proper maintenance and operation will be ensured by the college head.

23 Recording studio A recording studio is a specialized facility for recording and mixing instrumental or vocal musical performances, spoken words, and other sounds. They range in size from a small in-home project studio large enough to record a single singer-guitarist, to a large building with space for a full orchestra of 100 or more musicians. Ideally, both the recording and monitoring (listening and mixing) spaces are specially designed by an acoustician or audio engineer to achieve optimum acoustic properties (acoustic isolation or diffusion or absorption of reflected sound echoes that could otherwise interfere with the sound heard by the listeners.

Recording studios may be used to record singers, instrumental musicians (e.g., electric guitar, piano, saxophone, or ensembles such as orchestras), voice-over artists for advertisements or dialogue replacement in film, television, or animation, foley, or to record their accompanying musical soundtracks. The typical recording studio consists of a room called the "studio" or " live room" equipped with microphones and mic stands, where instrumentalists and vocalists perform; and the "control room", where audio engineers, sometimes with record producers, as well, operate professional audio mixing consoles, effects units, or computers with specialized software suites to mix, manipulate (e.g., by adjusting the equalization and adding effects) and route the sound for analog or digital recording. The engineers and producers listen to live music and the recorded "tracks" on high-quality monitor speakers or headphones.

Often, there will be smaller rooms called isolation booths to accommodate loud instruments such as drums or electric guitar amplifiers and speakers, to keep these sounds from being audible to the microphones that are capturing the sounds from other instruments or voices, or to provide "drier" rooms for recording vocals or quieter acoustic instruments such as an acoustic guitar or a fiddle. Major recording studios typically have a range of large, heavy, and hard-to-transport instruments and music equipment in the studio, such as a grand piano, Hammond organ, electric piano, harp, and drums.

A studio is a workplace for an artist in any field. Therefore, there is a strong need for the establishment of a recording studio for the department of music in KMGGPG College, Badalpur for the students to develop their talent in music. The following equipment's are needed for the recording studio:

For this, the college should have a gardener dedicated for the maintenance and conservation of the ground. There should be dedicated track built and maintained for the sports planned to be made on the ground towards the right side from the college's main entrance. Another important feature which is planned to be developed soon is stairs like podium along the periphery of both the grounds, which can be used for sitting by the students during their free time, as well as, during big events conducted in the college like sports or fairs etc. For this the college will need some equipment's like small rollers for making and then maintaining the tracks also. It is also planned that both the grounds should be cleaned regularly and there must be cutting and pruning of trees and bushes from time to time. The college is also planning to make and promote cycle tracks for the students. The college is also planning to establish sprinklers for watering the plants and gardens.

"Greenbelt" Is a general term that refers to natural, undeveloped, and/or agricultural lands that surround urban areas. These lands may include open spaces, parks, farms and ranches, wildlands, or a combination thereof—as designated by cities, counties, special districts, and other jurisdictions.

Greenbelts encompass many diverse types and scales of landscapes such as wildlife corridors, streams, wetlands, and recreational parks as well as grazing lands, orchards, and vineyards. Green "infrastructure," Greenbelt lands like wetlands, streams, meadows, forests, and others provide ecosystem services like water quality, air quality management, flood control, and carbon sequestration. The college has agricultural land at its back which can be considered greenbelts.
