## 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Introduction of Multidisciplinary Education Implementation:
Multidisciplinary education has been introduced at the graduation
level from the academic session 2021-22 in the state, according to
G.O. No.1567/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011TC dated 13-07-21. New
Education Policy (NEP) 2020 Interdisciplinary Learning: As per NEP
2020, it is mandatory for each student to opt for at least one
subject/paper (Major or Minor) from another faculty/discipline to
ensure interdisciplinary learning. Faculty Redefinition Purpose: The
faculty is redefined to ensure the smooth transition of the
education policy, as indicated by G.O.

No.1267/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 15-06-21. Course Selection Flexibility: Students now take courses from more than one faculty. For instance, science students opt for at least one course from the Arts or Commerce faculty, and vice-versa. Subject Change: Flexibility to change any subject (with prerequisites) after one year is allowed at the UG level. Students have the freedom to opt for any subject with some prerequisites. Minor/Elective Subject Options No Prerequisites: To ensure multidisciplinary education, there are no restrictions on opting for Minor/elective subjects. A student who has never studied a science subject until the 12th level can opt for it as a minor elective paper at the undergraduate level. Online Course Completion Recognized Platforms: Students are allowed to complete courses through recognized online platforms (up to 20% of total credits) to ensure multidisciplinary learning, as per G.O. No.1065/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 20-04-21. Inter-college Course Selection Flexibility: Students from different colleges can opt for their favorite subjects or courses from other colleges if not available in their own, truly ensuring an interdisciplinary system of education, according to G.O.

No.1065/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 20-04-21. NCC as a Minor Course Interdisciplinary Education: NCC can be opted for as a minor course at the UG level, ensuring interdisciplinary education, as per G.O. No.1815/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 09-08-21.

#### **16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

College cannot register on ABC, Only degree awarding HEIs can register on ABC, In our case our affiliating university have to register on ABC. A state-level academic bank of credits named ABACUS-UP is developed in line with central Government ABC, for easy credit transfer, college change and complete other all other work of HEIs, students, and faculty through a single platform. The college is registered on ABACUS-UP. All faculty and students of college admitted under NEP-2020 are already registered on ABACUS-UP

#### 17.Skill development:

Skill development in higher education plays a crucial role in nationbuilding by producing skilled and competent youth, fostering economic growth, innovation, and social development. In the higher education system, both knowledge and skills are essential to meet diverse employment needs across various fields. Therefore, the integration of vocational education programs into mainstream higher education is a primary focus. Vocational skills have become a mandatory component of all undergraduate curricula. Each student is required to opt for a skill course at the UG level (G.O. No.1065/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 20-04-21). Skill Development Courses The college offers 26 skill development/vocational courses on campus, with unlimited skill courses available online through MOOCs. Students can opt for these online courses as part of their curriculum according to NEP guidelines. Value-Added Courses From the academic session 2023-24, the college also offers 11 value-added courses designed to enhance students' proficiency beyond the standard curriculum. These courses impart additional subject knowledge and fundamental skills not covered in the main subjects, significantly enhancing students' employability. Industry-Academia Integration and Skill Development An industry-academia integration and skill development cell has been established in all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of Uttar Pradesh (G.O. No.142/Sattar-3-2021-8(35)/2020TC1 dated 15-01-21). The state vocational (skill) courses policy for HEIs has also been released (G.O. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-08-21). Each HEI is required to sign MoUs for internships, on-the-job training (OJT), and other training programs (G.O. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-08-21). Our college has signed Memoranda of Understanding with 25 skill partners, including industries, universities, institutes, NGOs, publication houses, companies, and related organizations. These partners participate in the skill-based training of our students, evaluate their practical assessments, and provide training certificates, fulfilling the New Education Policy's aim of integrating skill and formal education. Guidelines and Local Needs

Skill courses are designed following NSQF guidelines (G.O. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-08-21) and are tailored to meet local needs and facilities (e.g., ODOP). These trainings are scheduled during vacations or outside regular class hours to ensure mainstream classes are not disrupted. Curriculum Integration Skill-oriented aspects of each subject are highlighted in the syllabus. Students who opt for early exit (Certificate, Diploma) will receive a specific title in their subjects, enabling them to work in their chosen fields. State-Level Collaborations A state-level MoU has been signed with MSME for field and industry training (G.O. No.602/Sattar-3-2021-8(35)/2020 dated 22-02-21). The assessment system for skill development courses is predominantly based on practical training, with 60% of the assessment conducted by skill partners based on internship, apprenticeship, OJT, and training. Flexible Course Structure Skill development courses can be singular or progressive in nature, offered sequentially in successive semesters for specialization in a particular skill. Students have the flexibility to choose different skill courses in different semesters or specialize in a single skill. This comprehensive approach to skill development ensures that students gain practical, industry-relevant skills alongside their academic education, aligning with the objectives of the National Education Policy and fostering a well-rounded, skilled workforce.

As an integral component of the curriculum, the faculty orchestrates internship programs designed to provide hands-on, practical training, thereby honing the students' expertise. Moreover, the college actively supports students in securing employment opportunities by facilitating connections with the job market. Specialized Vocational Courses The college efficiently administers two UGC-sponsored B.Voc courses: Molecular Lab and Molecular Diagnostic Technology, and Airlines Tourism and Hospitality Management. These programs are strategically designed to impart comprehensive knowledge and skills in the domains of medical science and hospitality, respectively. Molecular Lab and Molecular Diagnostic Technology: Students demonstrate advanced proficiency in molecular laboratory techniques, ensuring accurate and reliable analysis in diagnostic settings. They implement and maintain quality assurance protocols, ensuring precision and reliability of diagnostic results. Additionally, students are equipped with the skills necessary for molecular research, contributing to advancements in medical science. Airlines Tourism and Hospitality Management: Graduates and diploma holders emerge as adept ambassadors of exceptional customer service, adjusted to the multifaceted needs within the dynamic domains of airlines, tourism, and hospitality. Empowered with managerial proficiency, students master the art of optimizing operational facets, elevating efficiency, and ensuring customer satisfaction. They undergo rigorous training to evolve into leaders, capable of steering teams, fostering collaboration, and orchestrating seamless operations within these industries. Skill and Vocational Education Integration To further integrate skill and vocational education into the general system, the college enabled students to acquire industry-relevant skills. Various departments designed 26 new skill courses, mandatory for students in the first two years. These courses, available online or offline, offered flexibility in completing credits. The college fostered partnerships with NGOs, institutions, and private organizations through MoUs, facilitating practical classes, short-

term training, and internships. This system continued in the current session with additional MoUs signed for effective implementation. Students emerge as well-rounded professionals, gaining a competitive edge in the job market. Community Approach Teaching Program The Community Approach Teaching program is a dynamic initiative integrated at various levels of academic programs, extending beyond traditional classroom boundaries. This approach empowers students with practical skills in conceptualization, planning, execution, monitoring, and evaluation of community development programs. It aims to produce graduates who are not only academically proficient but also socially conscious, contributing meaningfully to community development and societal well-being. National Cadet Corps, National Service Scheme, and Ranger Programs The program outcomes for National Cadet Corps (NCC), National Service Scheme (NSS), and Ranger programs focus on developing leadership qualities among youth, emphasizing discipline, team spirit, and a sense of responsibility. These programs promote personality development, community engagement, environmental sustainability, and a sense of national identity and social responsibility. Career Counselling and Placement Cell To guide students in career-related matters, the college established a Career Counselling and Placement Cell. Workshops, webinars, seminars, and short-term training programs were organized to enhance soft and specialized skills. Following NEP 2020, the college implemented a multiple exit and entry system, allowing students to drop and resume courses without losing academic progress. The Academic Bank of Credits System (ABACUS) was adopted for efficient credit management.

Our college adopts comprehensive waste management practices to ensure proper disposal and sustainability. Measures include soak pits for human solid waste, waste segregation charts, compost pits, color-coded bins, and sanitary napkin incinerators.

The campus features efficient water recycling systems with recharge pits, the use of condensed AC water for irrigation, push-button taps, double-flush toilets, and routine maintenance of RO water systems.

Solid waste recycling is a priority. Polythene bags and chips packets are repurposed by placing them in old cold drink and water bottles, which are then used as decorative garden fencing. Bottle caps are creatively transformed into eco-friendly tiles for park decoration, reducing waste. Additionally, old college papers are sent to an agency in exchange for A4 sheets, promoting reuse.

To manage e-waste, a red box is designated for collection, and both

faculty and students are encouraged to use it. Biomedical waste, though minimal, is carefully disposed of as per regulations.

The college avoids using radioactive or hazardous chemicals, but, if necessary, in the future, their disposal will be handled responsibly. Through these initiatives, we strive to maintain an ecofriendly campus while fostering awareness and sustainability among our community.

Our college adopts comprehensive waste management practices to ensure proper disposal and sustainability. Measures include soak pits for human solid waste, waste segregation charts, compost pits, color-coded bins, and sanitary napkin incinerators.

The campus features efficient water recycling systems with recharge pits, the use of condensed AC water for irrigation, push-button taps, double-flush toilets, and routine maintenance of RO water systems.

Solid waste recycling is a priority. Polythene bags and chips packets are repurposed by placing them in old cold drink and water bottles, which are then used as decorative garden fencing. Bottle caps are creatively transformed into eco-friendly tiles for park decoration, reducing waste. Additionally, old college papers are sent to an agency in exchange for A4 sheets, promoting reuse.

To manage e-waste, a red box is designated for collection, and both faculty and students are encouraged to use it. Biomedical waste, though minimal, is carefully disposed of as per regulations.

The college avoids using radioactive or hazardous chemicals, but, if necessary, in the future, their disposal will be handled responsibly. Through these initiatives, we strive to maintain an eco-friendly campus while fostering awareness and sustainability among our community.
